

THE JUNCTION PUB (AREA 5)

The Junction Pub is a landmark on Harborne High Street, being a natural focal point heading through Harborne towards Quinton. The pub sits at a junction of two roads and as the High Street curves it naturally forms a focal point when looking from the start of the road.

It was opened in 1904 for Mitchells and Butlers and is featured in old postcards as a key feature in the Birmingham suburb with its distinctive Victorian style architecture.

Historically the pub has hosted live music in its upstairs room in the 1980s and 1990s including David Gray, and there will be many who will associate this as a social landmark and part of the Harborne run, the 10-to-15-pub crawl along the high street.
