- 8      Centrally important figure on pathway through Cannon Hill Park.
- 9      Almost at my point of arrival i.e. Mac (Midlands Art Centre), Cannon Hill Park.
- 10     Remembering my pathways there and contemplating a return, while Looking back across Boating Pool situated next to Mac Cannon Hill Park.
